## Qualifications

Applicants must have basic medical qualifications and specialty medical training within the field specified above. The EU Directive 2005/36/EC is the legislation regulating the mutual recognition of professional qualifications by member states of the EEA/EU. For applicants outside the European Union, medical qualifications and licenses to practice are individually assessed for compatibility by the Icelandic Directorate of Health. Applicants must speak fluent English and/or speak a Scandinavian language.

The position is available immediately, but starting date is negotiable. We may fill more than one position, depending on the number and level of qualified applicants.
